In this course, you will learn how to make the world of informal writing and formal writing blend into one! The instructor will guide you through a variety of practical activities that can be used immediately, such as: using standards to create rubrics (if not using GaDOE rubrics), working backwards from exemplars, making writing accessible through pictures and listening activities, and leveraging explicit vocabulary to close reading, using rubrics to chunk writing to a text, implementing peer feedback loops for collaboration, and staying on top of grading in the process.
