Strategies for Teaching Low Incidence Disabilities June 01, thru June 15, 2022:Online

According to the definition in IDEA, <u>a low incidence disability</u> means a visual or hearing impairment, or simultaneous visual and hearing impairments, **a significant cognitive impairment**, or any impairment for which a small number of personnel with highly specialized skills and knowledge are needed in order for children with that impairment to receive early intervention services or a free appropriate public education (IDEA). Of identified students with disabilities, low incidence comprises less than 20%, so those specialized skills are necessary to meet the unique learning needs of this population. This class will provide participants with strategies and resources to effectively serve and support students of low incidence with a focus on significant cognitive impairments.

Young Mental Health First Aid (YMHFA) Training June 9, 2022: 8:300 AM - 4:00 PM

Youth Mental Health First Aid USA is an 8 hour public education program which introduces participants to the unique risk factors and warning signs of mental health problems in adolescents, builds understanding of the importance of early intervention, and teaches individuals how to help an adolescent in crisis or experiencing a mental health challenge. Mental Health First Aid uses role-playing and simulations to

demonstrate how to assess a mental health crisis; select interventions and provide initial help; and connect young people to professional, peer, social, and self-help care.

WHAT WILL PARTICIPANTS LEARN?

The course teaches participants the risk factors and warning signs of a variety of mental health challenges common among adolescents, including anxiety, depression, psychosis, eating disorders, AD/HD, disruptive behavior disorders, and substance use disorder. Participants do not learn to diagnose, nor how to provide any therapy or counseling – rather, participants learn to support a youth developing signs and symptoms of a mental illness or in an emotional crisis by applying a core five-step action plan:

Assess for risk of suicide or harm Listen nonjudgmentally Give reassurance and information Encourage appropriate professional help Encourage self-help and other support strategies

The Youth Mental Health First Aid USA curriculum is primarily focused on information participants can use to help adolescents and transition-age youth, ages 12-18.

Autism Intervention and Supports June 16, thru June 29, 2022: Online

About 1 in 54 children has been identified with autism spectrum disorder (ASD) according to estimates from CDC's Autism and Developmental Disabilities Monitoring (ADDM) Network. Autism Speaks notes that 31% of children with ASD have an intellectual disability (intelligence quotient [IQ] <70), 25% are in the borderline range (IQ 71–85), and 44% have IQ scores in the average to above-average range (i.e., IQ >85). While educators would agree that there is no perfect recipe for supporting students with ASD, there are certain guidelines, strategies, supports, and interventions that have proven to support the unique learning needs of the student with autism. This class will provide intervention and supports for students that present cognitively lower functioning, as well as higher functioning.
