Self-Compassion for Educators

Self-Compassion for Educators is a 6-hour, evidence- and skills-based training designed for educators to dive into the research, practice, and experience of self-compassion, enhance their personal well-being, and revitalize their deep motivation for helping others. Our brains are wired for survival and have a natural tendency, or negativity bias, to focus on and be motivated by negative thought patterns like criticism, pain, and danger. This self-compassion training helps educators understand and

transform these habitual responses and develop the ability to motivate with compassion rather than self-criticism. Science shows that self-compassion has a significant positive impact on educator well-being, resilience, and stress management. Practicing self-compassion involves taking action and making positive changes in our lives, and through this process, we see educators reconnecting with their deep motivation and excitement for helping others. Course Outcomes: • Build an understanding of mindful self-compassion and its elements • Explore the benefits of self-compassion • Learn how to integrate mindfulness and self-compassion into daily life • Use self-compassion to handle difficult emotions with greater ease • Practice motivating yourself with kindness rather than criticism • Use self-compassion to live in accord with your values.

Classroom management is not simply the absence of discipline problems, but an intentional set of practices that promote a positive environment for all students. What does this look like in the secondary face-to-face classroom? Routines, rituals, protocols, and strategies intentionally taught and reinforced that promote engagement, prevent off-task behaviors, and communicate caring with all, especially struggling, students.

This course is designed to help teachers in grades 6-12 organize and manage the learning environment to create a sense of community and maximize academic success. The course will provide ideas, strategies, and emotional objectivity to promote learning. This course supports teacher performance in Standard 7 of TKES and is suitable for both beginning and veteran teachers who wish to set their students up for success with proactive, positive classroom management supports.

Digital Tools for Administrators

Date: December 6, 2023; Time: 8:30 AM - 12:30 PM

This course is designed to provide administrators, instructional coaches, or graduation coaches with the skills to use the digital resources at their disposal to analyze data, identify student needs, and make data-driven, informed instructional and organizational decisions. Administrators and coaches are consistently confronted with the challenges of triangulating and using data from multiple sources that do not always integrate with one another cleanly. This course will enable you to increase your comfort with using the tools that are available within EXCEL to combine, manage, and compare various reports that you have access to from local student information systems, MAP scores, Milestones, PSAT, etc. to inform your decision making at the school level.

Specifically, the strategies and tools that are explored in this course are designed to help strengthen school-based leaders in Standards 1 (Instructional Leadership) and 3 (Planning and Assessment) of the Leader Keys Effectiveness System. The session will explore the use of pivot tables, filters, conditional formatting, auto-population, and other tools within Microsoft Excel. Administrators and coaches completing the course will be better equipped to analyze comprehensive data points to identify student needs, review interventions, and make data-driven building level decisions.

In this course, you will learn how to make the world of informal writing and formal writing blend into one! Come master how to facilitate and guide scholars into the navigation of how to be creative in their own thinking and use the thinking of others to support their opinions.

The instructor will guide you through a variety of practical activities that can be used immediately, such as: using standards to create rubrics (if not using GaDOE rubrics), working backwards from exemplars, making writing accessible through pictures and listening activities, and leveraging explicit vocabulary to close reading, using rubrics to chunk writing to a text, implementing peer feedback loops for collaboration, and staying on top of grading in the process. (TKES Standards 1, 3, 7, and 8). This class is for 3rd-12th Teachers.
