Using a cognitive coaching model, with particular attention to authentic practices for effecting coaching in coaches, this endorsement provides the skills and knowledge to bring about positive change in the school setting. This Endorsement is completely virtual.

In the first course, *Skills of Effective Coaching*, participants will self-assess their knowledge, skills, and dispositions to become effective coaches, engage in exploring and understanding effective coaching practices including various coaching styles, social-emotional strategies for educators, impactful communication, and cultural proficiency. Candidates will improve their skills in data analysis and decision-making, as well as goal development to improve teaching practice.

Assistive Technology for the New Special Education Teacher

The Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) mandates the school system's responsibility to provide assistive technology devices and services to students with disabilities. Assistive technology devices are any item, piece of equipment or product system, whether acquired commercially off the shelf, modified, or customized, that is used to increase, maintain, or improve the functional capabilities of children with disabilities, not to include surgically implanted devices. The definition of an assistive technology device is very broad and gives IEP teams the flexibility that they need to

make decisions about appropriate assistive technology devices for individual students. This class will discuss what assistive technology is and how it can help your students succeed by providing equal access.
