# Griffin RESA Teacher Academy for Preparation and Pedagogy (TAPP)

### What is GaTAPP?

The Georgia Teacher Academy for Preparation and Pedagogy (GaTAPP) is a classroom-based teacher. preparation option for individuals who have the basic qualifications to teach elementary, middle-grades, secondary or P-12 education but have not completed a teacher preparation program. The program is intended to replace regular college teacher education programs. It is, instead, an alternative option for individuals who hold a bachelor's degree or higher but did not complete teacher education requirements as part of their degree programs. Georgia TAPP equips teacher candidates with the skills to ensure a reasonable expectation of initial success in their classrooms and puts in place a supervised induction program that will help them move toward subsequent mastery of teaching.

### What are the requirements?

- Hold a bachelor's degree from an accredited college/university
- Passing score on GACE II Content Area tests prior to entry into the area you will be teaching
- Pass the Georgia Educator Ethics Assessment (#360)
- Have a job offer as a beginning teacher in a Griffin RESA-member system (Butts, Fayette, Griffin-Spalding, Henry, Lamar, Newton, Pike, Thomaston-Upson)

- Take the "Essentials of Effective Teaching" course. Register below.

The tuition for the Essentials of Effective Teaching Pre-TAPP session is \$600, which includes all books and supplies. If participants secure a contracted teaching position in our region, the \$600 fee will be applied to the first year's TAPP tuition. We will advertise eligible candidates on our Pre-TAPP List for the 2024/2025 school year.

You only need one session.

# APEL Tier I and Tier II Virtual Programs



### **OVERVIEW**

Griffin RESA's Georgia Alternative Preparation for Educational Leadership (APEL) program is a one-year job-embedded pathway for candidates seeking Tier I or Tier II Leadership certification.

This program is for educators, in system or school leadership positions, with a master's degree or higher who are looking for leadership certification only (non-degree).

APEL is designed to instruct, guide, and support employed leaders to help them build the confidence, skills, and presence needed to lead.

### **APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS**

- College Transcripts showing a Master's Degree or higher with a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0
- Professional Resume including:
  - Universities/Colleges attended, degrees earned, GPA
  - Educator work experience including organization, position, location, supervisor, dates
  - Leadership experience or leadership training including organization or program, position, location, supervisor, dates
- Three signed professional reference letters.
- Alternative Preparation for Educational Leadership (APEL) Nomination Form completed by direct supervisor with an overall rating of 3.0 or higher
- APEL System Assurance Form
- APEL Authorization for Payment Form
- APEL Program Memorandum of Understanding
- A copy of the following,
  - your last Proficient Annual Evaluation
  - o your GaPSC Certificate.
  - completed Georgia Ethics for Educational Leadership Assessment - GACE 380
- No ethics violations or reprimands are allowed.
- Submitted Writing Sample

### Candidate must

- Hold an entry-level P-12 school leadership positions below the principal and system level positions that does not supervise principals.
- Be recommended for admission by a local Unit of Administration (LUA) or employer that will verify employment and provide an assurance that the candidate will be available one-half day or more each day to work in a leadership position

### Candidate must

- Hold an advanced level P-12 school leadership position as principal or the equivalent, superintendents or other LUA staff who supervise principals.
- Hold a level 5 or higher Standard Professional Educational Leadership Tier I certificate or a Standard Prof. L-certificate in Educational Leadership Tier
  II
- Be recommended for admission by a Local Unit of Administration (LUA) or employer that will verify employment and provide an assurance that the candidate will be available one-1/2 day or more each day to work in a leadership position.

Each candidate is assigned a system or school Leadership Mentor and a Griffin RESA Leadership Coach. The leadership mentor assists the candidate throughout the APEL process. The leadership coach assists in meeting program standards for certification.


