Griffin RESA Awarded Grant for Endorsement Scholarships and GaTAPP

Griffin RESA is pleased to announce it has been awarded three grants totaling over \$1.5 million dollars from the Georgia Department of Education for Teacher and Leader Support and Development over the next two years. The GaDOE Teacher and Leader Support and Development Grants were created to support Georgia Educators with teacher knowledge and student impact. The grant provides full endorsement tuition, books, and fees so there is no cost to the educator.

Grants awarded include the Expanding Opportunities for Teachers: Teachers & Teacher Leader Endorsements Grant with an award of \$989,338 and the GaTAPP Allocations for Recruitment of TAPP Teachers to Increase the Teacher Pipeline Award of \$419,009. In total, grants awarded were \$1,408,347.



2nd APEL Cohort Alternative Preparation for Educational Leadership

Application Packet due by May 20, 2022







Griffin RESA's Georgia Alternative Preparation for Educational Leadership (APEL) program is scheduled to begin in July 2022. APEL will offer a one year job embedded pathway for candidates seeking Tier I or Tier II Leadership certification. This program is designed for educators with a Master's degree or higher who are looking for leadership certification-only (non-degree). APEL is designed to instruct, guide, and support employed leaders helping them build the confidence, skills, and presence needed to lead.

- **Tier I Certification:** Candidates must hold entry-level leadership positions, which include P-12 school level positions below the principal and system level positions that do not supervise principals.
- **Tier II Certification:** Candidates must hold advanced leadership positions, which include P-12 school level principals or the equivalent, superintendents, or other LUA staff who supervise principals. In addition to employment in a leadership position the candidate must already hold a level 5 or higher Standard Professional Educational Leadership Tier I certificate or a Standard Professional L-certificate in Educational Leadership Tier II.
- **Tier I and Tier II Certification:** Candidates must be recommended for admission by a local Unit of Administration (LUA) or employer that will verify employment and provide an assurance that the candidate will be available one-half day or more each day to work in a leadership position.


