Preparing for Dyslexia Law: From Tier 1 through Interventions

In Georgia, there are two new laws that will have a huge impact on schools, all students in K-3rd grade and students with characteristics of dyslexia. The Georgia Early Literacy Act requires that all elementary schools provide instruction based on the science of reading/structured literacy for all kindergarten through 3rd grade students. Senate Bill 48 requires that school districts screen the same students for characteristics of dyslexia and provide effective interventions. During this session, participants will receive an overview of the science of reading and how to provide explicit, systematic instruction that is grounded in decades of research. In addition, participants will receive Information on screening and how to provide interventions to students who have reading deficits, including those with characteristics of dyslexia.
