

LEAding by Example for Leaders of SWD Special Education Law October 24, 2023 9:00am-3:00pm



Every student who receives special education services is covered by the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA). This federal law defines what states must do to meet the needs of students with disabilities. In this course, the history, foundations, and current events of special education that has led to the development of these laws will be covered. Topics will include cases in the law that inform our practices, procedural due process, and local implications. Participants will gain confidence in their procedural knowledge and will receive resources and guidance that points them to answers when they are unsure of what to do.

ABOUT THE COURSE

Youth Mental Health First Aid USA is a full day public education program which introduces participants to the unique risk factors and warning signs of mental health problems in adolescents, builds understanding of the importance of early intervention, and teaches individuals how to help an adolescent in crisis or experiencing a mental health challenge. Mental Health First Aid uses roleplaying and simulations to demonstrate how to assess a mental health crisis; select interventions and provide initial help; and connect young people to professional, peer, social, and self-help


