Strategies for Teaching Students with Low Incidence Disabilities

According to the definition in IDEA, a low incidence disability means a visual or hearing impairment, or simultaneous visual and hearing impairments, a significant cognitive impairment, or any impairment for which a small number of personnel with highly specialized skills and knowledge are needed in order for children with that impairment to receive early intervention services or a free appropriate public education (IDEA).

Of identified students with disabilities, low incidence comprises less than 20%, so those specialized skills are necessary to meet the unique learning needs of this population. This class will provide participants with strategies and resources to effectively serve and support students of low incidence with a focus on significant cognitive impairments.
